Expect:

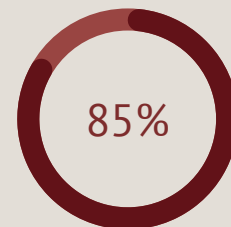
- Bigger properties (acreage parcels or quarter sections).

Key Considerations Before You Buy

◆ Water & Sewer

Ask if the property uses a cistern, hauls water or had a dugout. Enquire if there is a lagoon or septic system.

◆ Power & Heat

Rural homes may use propane, natural gas (if available), or electric heating. Confirm delivery access for propane and backup options for winter outages.

◆ Road Access

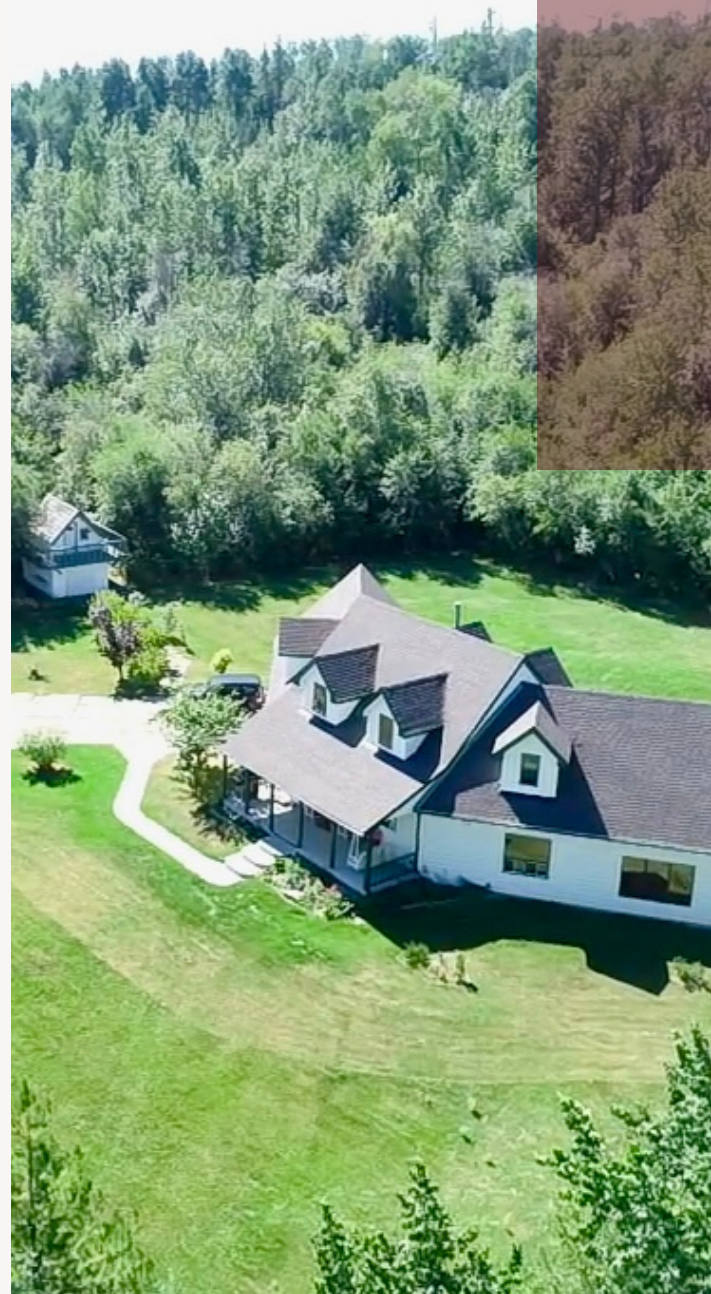
Check year-round access and who maintains the road? Not all roads are plowed in heavy snow, most are looked after by Argo Road Maintenance.

◆ Internet & Cell Coverage

Rural areas often rely on satellite or LTE internet. Ask about coverage before moving equipment or starting a home business.

◆ Zoning & Land Use

Peace River Regional District zoning bylaws determine what you can build or keep — from animals to additional dwellings. Nyla can help you confirm restrictions before you buy.

- Rural mortgages often require larger down payments if the property includes more than 10 acres or multiple dwellings.
- Some lenders exclude outbuildings or unserviced land from appraised value – Nyla works closely with local lenders who understand rural properties.
- Home insurance may vary depending on fire protection proximity – being near a fire hall helps.
